

AMCI 2D 1201  
AGGRAVATED ROBBERY

To sustain a charge of aggravated robbery, the State must prove the following things beyond a reasonable doubt:

First: That, with the purpose of committing a theft, Defendant employed or threatened to employ physical force upon another; and

Second: That Defendant was armed with a deadly weapon or represented by words or conduct that he was armed with a deadly weapon, or inflicted or attempted to inflict death or serious physical injury upon another person.

If you have reasonable doubt of the defendant's guilt on the charge of Aggravated Robbery, you will then consider the charge of First Degree Burglary.
